### Apache Trail

Explore a part of the Arizona history. Follow the footsteps the Native Americans, Cowboys and Prospectors took through the mysterious and legendary Superstition Mountains – The Lost Dutchman Gold Mine, Tortilla Flat Trading Post, and the way to Roosevelt Dam. The Apache Trail once served as a stage coach and freight wagon route from Mesa to Globe. Approximately a one hour drive time, and a 4 hour trail adventure. Imagine yourself at the 1910 Constitutional Convention as you sit at a desk in the House of Representatives chamber. Write your own bill and take it on an interactive journey into law – if you are able! See the USS Arizona Silver Service along with a piece of the ship (one of the USS Arizona Anchors) and spend a moment remembering the lives lost at Pearl Harbor. In the midst of urban development and modern technology, it can also show us how the past remains meaningful today. Established to preserve the 1,500 ancient petroglyphs on its grounds and operated by Arizona State University's department of Anthropology. **Desert Botanical Garden**

Wondering about all those weird prickly things you keep seeing? You are still filled with wonder after examining some of the 20,000 types of desert plants gathered here from around the world, but you will be armed with a lot more information. The ethnobotany displays on the Plants & People of the Sonoran Desert Trail, for example, detail how the native peoples of this area turned the local flora into everything from food to shoes. Visit the Garden today and enjoy specialized tours, demonstrations, concerts, family activities, seasonal exhibits, and outdoor café and plant shop. A map of the trail is available at the garden. Wear comfortable shoes. Wandering the grounds at a leisurely pace takes a minimum of 2 hours. If you are pressed for time, you can duck into the Succulent House and Cactus House and loop back to the entrance of the gift shop in 45 minutes. ### Hoo-hoogam Ki Museum

Perhaps the best way to gain appreciation for the lifestyles, history and culture of the Pima and Maricopa Tribes is to begin your visit to the community at the Hoo-hoogam Ki Museum, 10,005 E. Osborn Road. Hoo-hoogam Ki, meaning "House of the ancestors," describes the museum, which is constructed of adobe and desert plants, reflecting the beauty of the Southwest. Inside you will view exhibits that share our unique heritage, from the days of the ancient Hohokam to the achievements of today. Baskets, pottery, photos and other articles create an understanding of a people who are enriched by the strength of their ancestors. If your timing is right, you might see a demonstration of Pima basketry or Maricopa pottery in progress. For a special treat, be sure to sample authentic Indian foods in the outdoor dining area of the museum. Delicious Indian fry bread is always a popular choice. ### Japanese Friendship Garden (and Tea House)

The garden features more than 1,500 tons of handpicked rock, more than 50 varieties of plants, flowing streams, a scenic waterfall and a Koi pond. The Garden's name, Ro Ho En, is a combination of three Japanese words – Ro means Heron, a bird symbol of Himeji City, Japan, a Sister City of Phoenix - Ho is the Japanese word for the City of Phoenix bird – En means garden. The Japanese Tea House, located on the grounds of the Garden, features authentic Japanese tea ceremonies (reservations required).

### McCormick Stillman Railroad Park

This park is a kick for both kids and adult rail buffs -Treat yourself to a few hours of outdoor fun at McCormick-Stillman Railroad Park, located on the southeast corner of Scottsdale Road and Indian Bend Road in Scottsdale. Mystery Castle is open October to mid-June on Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. Try to visit before it gets too hot!

Old Town Scottsdale – Historical Downtown District – experience the taste of the Old West. A stroll through Old Town takes you back to the original Scottsdale, the heart of the "West's Most Western Town" that began more than 100 years ago. Amidst designated historic buildings you will find the perfect treasures from Western wear, books, galleries, home décor, Southwest jewelry, and restaurants. Visit the 1909 Little Red Schoolhouse, now the Scottsdale historical Museum. Enjoy a visit to the "Sugar Bowl" Scottsdale's first & still the best ice cream parlor/restaurant. In downtown Scottsdale's Historic shopping district you will find more than 400 one-of-a-kind shops, galleries, restaurants, nightlife, museums and entertainment venues.
